Graduation Requirements

New York State Assessments: Graduates must satisfy the NYS testing requirements: one exam each in core subject areas (English, Social Studies, Math, Science) and one additional pathway exam in Social Studies, Math or Science

For New York State Regents Diploma: Graduates must pass the NYS Regents exams listed above with a 65% or higher and/or receive a minimum score for an alternate exam.

For the New York State Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation: Graduates must pass the NYS Regents exams listed above and 2 additional math Regents exams, both the Living Environment and Physical Setting Science exam, and complete a sequence.

Curriculum Information – Class of 2024

Wheatland-Chili High School offers approximately 100 courses, including 6 Advanced Placement courses. An identified student may accelerate in two areas in eighth grade: Mathematics and Language other than English (LOTE). In addition, students in Project Lead the Way, Art, or Business classes may pursue a NYS Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation when a sequence of 5 classes is obtained. Online courses also offered.

English: Regents courses in grades 9 – 12; AP Language & Composition (11th) and AP Literature & Composition (12th).

Social Studies: Regents courses in grades 9–12 in Global History (9/10), United States History & Government (11) or AP American History (11), and Economics/Participation in Government (12); Additional options include four (semester) electives – The World Today, Psychology, Sociology, and Criminal Law.

Math: Regents courses in grades 9-12 in Algebra CC, Geometry CC, Algebra 2 CC; Pre-Calculus; AP Calculus AB; Foundations of College Math; One elective — Intro to Computer Programming.

Science: Regents courses in grades 9-12 in Earth Science, Living Environment, Chemistry, Physics; AP Biology; Special Interest electives available include four (semester) electives – Biodiversity, Environmental Science, Plant Propagation, and Landscaping.

Physical Education and Health

Online World of Learning (OWL): 150+ courses offered for students in a variety of areas to fulfill graduation requirements and expand career-focused exploration. Full year and half year courses taught completely online through BOCES - AccelerateU and APEX. All courses taught by NYS certified teachers. Students earn 1.0 or 0.5 credit for full or half year courses, respectively.

World Languages: Spanish Levels I, II, III, IV and French Levels II, III, IV. Regional Exam at Level III. Level V available online. Seal of BiLiteracy offered.

Music: High School Mixed Chorus and Concert Band. Electives include AP Music Theory and Beginning Piano.

Art: Studio in Art, Drawing & Painting, Computer Graphics, Photography, Portfolio Preparation, and AP 2D Art/Design.

Business: Career & Financial Management, Computer Applications, Accounting, Entrepreneurship & Marketing, Business Law, Business Math Applications, and Business Management.

Technology: Features 5 courses in the Project Lead the Way Pre-Engineering Program (all courses can be taken for RIT college credit) – Design & Drawing for Production, Digital Electronics, Principles of Engineering, Computer Integrated Manufacturing, and Civil Engineering & Architecture.

Career and Technical Education: Vocational training is comprised of 22 subject areas through Monroe BOCES II.

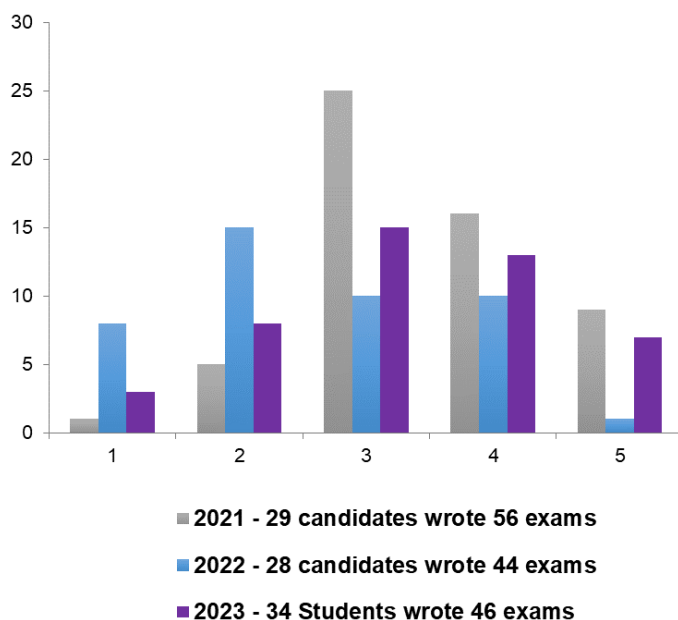
