- 1. Support high quality leadership throughout Wheatland-Chili Central Schools focused on instructional excellence.

 - Promote differentiation of instruction to meet the diverse needs of students.

 - Create a rigorous curricular program that develops critical thinking, problem solving, study skills, and supports the construction of meaning.
 - Develop assessment systems aligned with the curriculum to monitor and communicate student progress.
 - Support actions to promote alignment of curriculum and instructional practices with Common Core Learning Standards.
- 3. Support shared accountability for student academic and social success, and operational efficiencies, through high expectations for all staff.
 - Create a school culture that demonstrates a shared commitment from <u>all staff</u> in the belief that <u>all</u> students can learn.
 - Create a school culture where all staff members are focused on customer service.
 - Support a shared commitment to high standards of learning through appropriate professional development for all staff.
 - Ensure that individual student needs inform all aspects of schooling.
 - Create a school culture that proactively advocates for children, families, and caregivers.

 - Support experiences for K-12 students to learn about the world of work, explore career options (volunteer, shadowing, internship experiences, etc.), and relate personal skills, aptitudes, and abilities to future career decisions.
