Your student has expressed a desire to join the Middle or High School Ski and Snowboard Club this year. Our goal is to make sure that each student has a great experience, regardless of skiing and snowboarding experience. We continue to work closely with Swain to provide a positive and safe experience. This year all payments and purchases and some of the paperwork will occur online – please note this is different than in some previous years. This year, we will travel to Swain for 6 Thursday nights, beginning (weather permitting) on January 4, 2024. If a trip needs to be cancelled due to weather or lack of snow, we will add additional nights to be sure to reschedule so that we have all six trips.

Ski Club will operate as it has in past years with a maximum of 42 students in Middle School and 42 students in High School Ski Club. Last year we were right at our maximum capacity – but to date we have not had to turn anyone away. With that being said, Ski and Snowboard Club is first come/first served.

In addition, and back by popular demand, will be a Ski and Snowboard Club trip to Holiday Valley on Saturday January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2024 (with a make-up date of Saturday February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024). More information about this trip will come out as it gets closer. Students wishing to attend must be a part of ski club, and will need to bring the correct amount of cash the day of the trip along with a slip to board the bus. We will leave school at 7:00 AM and return to school around 6:00 PM. The cost will be \$68 for a lift ticket (\$54 if under 12 years old) and \$47 for rental (with a helmet, \$38 without – or if under 12 years old \$39 or \$30 without helmet). We just wanted this information to be available as soon as possible so that you may think ahead. Families are welcome to pay us ahead of time and meet us there to qualify for the same rates.

The attached pages contain the traditional information and questions/answers for Ski and Snowboard Club as well as ordering instructions. If at any time you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact either of us.

Skiing and snowboarding are lifelong physical activities that promote a healthy, fun and positive social activity. Again, please do not hesitate to contact either of us at any time with questions. Take care, stay healthy, and think snow!

### GENERAL SKI AND SNOWBOARD CLUB INFORMATION:

Ski Club is open to ANY student in Grades 6-12. We will begin skiing/snowboarding as soon as there is enough snow. This will probably be Thursday, January 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Any days missed due to weather will be made up. We will travel to Swain Winter Resort by bus, leaving school at 2:45 PM (Middle School) and 3:05 PM (High School) and arrive back at Wheatland-Chili between 9:30 and 9:40 PM. You should plan on picking your child up then. We will issue a 15-minute warning on the bus for students to call or text home.

Students new to the club are required to take one lesson per week for the first four weeks. Failure to take a lesson could mean loss of skiing privilege. We encourage students to take lessons no matter what their ability level since none of us ever stops learning.

As this is a school-sponsored activity, students must adhere to all school rules. Students may not smoke and may not carry nor use controlled substances at any time with the club. The advisors and chaperones will be checking periodically to ensure that none of this material is transported. Students in the club must travel to and from the ski area on the bus when the club is skiing – **no student is allowed to transport themselves**! If parents are skiing the same night, they will need to see the advisor (face to face) each evening if they are transporting their student home (to be sure everyone is accounted for). Inappropriate behavior by students, as judged by the Swain staff, advisors, bus drivers and chaperones may result in expulsion from the club. Tickets will be given to be used independently of ski club. We will enforce these policies and request your cooperation.

Swain is once again offering discounted prices for ALL – so take advantage and buy tickets for you and your family through the ski club this year and save big. If you want to give the gift of ski club for the holidays, please take advantage of these prices. As a reminder, the prices change on November 15<sup>th</sup>, so be sure to sign up before then.

THE LARGEST CHANGE FOR THIS YEAR is in ticketing procedures. This year (like last year) all purchasing will occur online. However, Swain has returned to shipping tickets to the advisor, not to the individuals. Each week, your student will receive their tickets on the bus unless a family needs other arrangements. The advisor will give the meal and rental ticket each week (as applicable) and turn in the lift coupon on the student behalf to get a lift ticket for the student jacket. Students will then have to hold on to their rental and meal coupons until the appropriate time. Please note that this is a change from last year when tickets were shipped to the purchaser, but a return to the way it was for several years prior. We will not have extra tickets for students to use if they lose them once handed out. Families that order through the club will receive tickets from me (we can arrange for me to send with your student or drop to you).

Skiing and snowboarding are lifelong physical activities that promote a healthy, fun and positive social activity. Again, please do not hesitate to contact either of us at any time with questions. Take care, stay healthy, and think snow!

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS AND FAMILIES:

Dear Parent or Guardian,

October 2, 2023

For many Middle School students, this is the first opportunity to take a recurring field trip a significant distance away from home. Although this may be a new experience for parents and students, I assure you that ski club is a safe environment that allows students the unique opportunity to gain an athletic skill while simultaneously building new relationships with peers. This letter, in addition to the first letter, will hopefully answer any questions that you have about the logistics of ski club. #### **General Information:**

We will travel to Swain Winter Resort by WC bus, leaving the Middle School at 2:45 PM (at the latest). We will arrive at Swain by 3:55 and have all of our equipment ready to go by 4:10 (a little later the first time out). We will leave Swain at 8:30 PM, and students are expected to budget their time so that they are not late for the bus (chaperones will also issue reminders). We will arrive back at the Middle/High School at 9:35 PM and you should plan on picking your child up then (at the Middle School).

### **Eligibility and Participation in Modified Sports:**

If a student in ski club receives an administrative detention or is in In-School Suspension on the day of ski club, they are not allowed to participate for that day. Should that occur, parents may pick up tickets for use on weekends. For each outing, students must report to the Sports Study Hall, and remain there until picked up by an advisor. Students are expected to use the time after school to complete homework. Many students have also taken advantage of the transportation time to complete assignments and readings.

In a small school such as WC, students have the opportunity to participate in a variety of sports and activities. Once ski club starts for the season, many modified sports are underway. Students should check with individual coaches to learn their policy regarding participation in Ski Club and sports simultaneously. In agreement with some coaches, students may participate in modified sports and ski club at the same time. Students will still attend regularly scheduled games for sports, even if they fall on a Thursday. Student's should likely purchase of a 4-night program if they plan to participate in sports at the same time (instead of a 6-night). In the past, students will attend ski club on practice days but games on game days. Please remember that game/meet schedules may have not been determined at the time of this letter, but that you may check <a href="https://www.sectionvny.org">www.sectionvny.org</a> to look at sports schedules as they become available.

### Procedures (a more detailed list of procedures will be available to students who sign up):

The bus will leave at 2:45 PM at the latest for Swain. If students are not on the bus, it will be assumed by the advisors that the student will not be present for the particular evening. As students board the bus, they will receive their tickets for the evening.

If students have their own equipment, they will be able to store it at the school on Thursdays. Students at the Middle School building can bring equipment to the auditorium to store it for the day upon arrival. There will be a procedure for loading the bus and van closer to the season.

Students will be given the tag for their jacket as they exit the bus, and will need their rental ticket (if applicable) in their pocket and ready. Students are escorted through the process of getting their equipment. Students new to the club are required to take lessons, and lessons begin immediately after students depart the

rental building. Lessons are one hour in length, and students are allowed (and encouraged) to take as many lessons as they wish, as they are included in the price of skiing. Should your student wish to switch from skiing to snowboarding for the year, they can make this change one time (so that students are not flip-flopping between the two).

Students must remain with a partner at all times. Students will be able to quickly identify those at a similar ability level and ski or snowboard with them. If students do not have a partner, one of our staff members will be happy to accompany them. The cafeteria is open from 4:30 PM until 7:30 PM. Students can decide when to eat, but generally like to eat as a group around 5:30. Again, if they purchased meal tickets, these are held on to by the students and are treated as cash (so they cannot be replaced if lost).

If your child needs assistance during the evening, they can come to the lodge to locate a Wheatland employee, can ask a Swain employee to page a Wheatland staff member, or (if on the hill) stop a Ski Patrol member. Mr. Melville generally gives out his cell number to each student in case of an emergency. The Ski Patrol also assists in the event of injury. Students are reminded to stay on hills that are of their ability level, as most injuries occur as a result of a student using terrain beyond their ability level. In the event that your child is injured during the evening, the Swain Ski Patrol or I will contact you directly. Most injuries are minor and can be treated by the highly trained Patrol members. The Patrol may recommend a doctor's visit the next day. In the event of a serious injury (i.e. a broken bone), a student may need to be transported to the hospital. Students are transported by the Canaseraga Ambulance to Noyes Hospital in Dansville, or the parent is asked to come get their student for further evaluation (in less serious instances). A Wheatland-Chili staff member accompanies students until parents can arrive. Again, this is a rare occurrence, and has only happened three times in the past fifteen years at the High School level, and never at the Middle School level during evening outings.

Students need to be on the bus and ready to leave by 8:30 PM. It takes about 10 minutes to return equipment and prepare for the ride home. We will inform students when we are approximately 15 minutes from the school so that they may call home to arrange a ride. The bus will be in the bus loop at the Middle/High School at 9:30 PM. Students will not have access to the building for warmth, so your promptness is encouraged. All of the procedures for ski club will be reviewed again with all participants on the first night of skiing.

### Swain/Wheatland-Chili Partnership:

Swain and Wheatland continue to partner together to bring you the highly discounted prices. Likewise, Swain will continue to assign a "coach" for each student taking lessons. This will be their coach for the season...this way they can focus on building skills from week to week. This is an amazing program that will be extremely beneficial to all of our young skiers and snowboarders – building skills and reducing injuries. Swain has also improved the rental process and building this year to make it more efficient for our students.

### **Family Tickets:**

If you or your family skis or snowboards and you would like to take advantage of the discounted student rate for other children in your family, please contact me, as you can purchase these passes at a lower cost as a family member. The average discount of skiing with a club vs. regular ticketing is about 50%, so if your other children or you yourself want to learn, doing so through a club is a wise move! Ticket prices are almost the same this year as they were last year!

#### Ski and Snowboard Club for the Holidays:

Last year, many parents gave a Ski Club membership as a gift to their child for the holidays. If you are interested in doing so, please contact me by phone or e-mail (so that I do not ruin the surprise)! Meal vouchers

are also available again this year, and were popular with parents and students last year as an alternative to a bag dinner or carrying cash!

Swain is also offering discounted pricing for families again this year, which represents a significant discount. If your family skis, please consider ordering through the club!

#### **Payment Arrangements:**

If you would like to sign your student up for Ski and Snowboard Club but need to break up the payments, you may do so through the Swain website. Payment is generally made online directly to Swain.

### Signing-Up and Summary:

To sign up your student, complete your purchasing at <a href="www.swain.com/clubs">www.swain.com/clubs</a> and then complete pages 9, 11 and 13 (all students) and 15 (students that rent) and return to Mr. or Mrs. Melville before November 15<sup>th</sup>. PLEASE REMEMBER TO ADD "WHEATLAND CHILI" TO YOUR CART (so your order gets tagged to our school). Please be sure to read the liability release statement form and sign it with your student. The prices go up after the first deadline, so act fast. Parents and students share that they were happy with the positive experience that Ski and Snowboard was for their child! Similarly, students who participated in the all-day field trip to Swain last year couldn't wait to do it again! Again, any questions – please let me know!


